BTP PROTOCOL

PREVENTION MEASURES FOR BTP STAFF

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing
- Use paper towels when drying your hands
- Use hand sanitizer (that contains at least 60% alcohol) regularly
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Maintain at least 1 meter between yourself and anyone who is coughing or sneezing
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue
- Clean frequently touched surfaces and objects daily (e.g., tables, countertops, light switches, doorknobs, and cabinet handles) by using a regular household detergent and water
- Avoid any physical greetings/ handshakes with BTP visitors
- Sanitize your hands after customer contact
- Stay home when you feel ill, have fever, cough and difficulty breathing. Seek immediate medical attention and follow instructions of our health authority

PREVENTIVE MEASURES TAKEN BY BTP

- BTP will provide a hand sanitizer bottle to each department
- BTP will make hand sanifizers available in all public areas
- Public areas will be sprayed and wiped with disinfectants multiple times a day
- Countertops, light switches and doorknobs in public areas will be cleaned multiple times a day by using detergents
- BTP will put more emphasis on office hygiene & cleanliness
- Staff can request BTP to provide protective masks
